CAPAY VALLEY VISION RELEASES RESOURCE PUBLICATION Atlas Serves as Community Planning Tool

WOODLAND – Representatives of Capay Valley Vision, Inc. made a presentation today before the Yolo County Board of Supervisors to announce the release of the organization’s new publication, the *Capay Valley Atlas*.

The *Capay Valley Atlas* is a 36-page, full-color guide to the natural and economic resources of the valley. It includes eight maps as well narrative descriptions of soil and water resources, agricultural crop patterns, and community history. Photographs depict scenic vistas and historic structures.

“The Atlas is intended to serve as a planning tool for community members working through Capay Valley Vision to develop a sense of place and an overall consensus on local desires for the future,” says Thomas Nelson, the organization’s executive director. CVV will distribute copies through workshops and other organizational activities this fall.

Compiled and edited by Ann Scheuring, the Atlas includes contributions by various county offices including those of the Agricultural Commissioner and Planning and Public Works. With the support of Supervisor Lynnel Pollock, these offices contributed staff time and a considerable amount of information to the development of the publication. Design and production were the work of Gary Sandy Communications.
