Barry "The Fish" Melton is Yolo County's Chief Public Defender but he's also known as one of the great guitarists of the San Francisco '60s psychedelic scene. Co-founder of Country Joe and the Fish, Melton is a veteran of Woodstock and still plays a sizzling six-string. He's ready to jam in "Rockin' In The Beautiful Capay Valley," a benefit concert for Capay Valley Vision on Sunday, March 18th at 7:00p.m. in Cache Creek Casino Resort's **Club 88**.

His band is a composition of formidable musicians – Roy Blumenfeld (Blues Project) on drums, Peter Albin (Big Brother and the Holding Company) on bass and Bill Scholer on guitar. Melton is also pleased to present legendary bluesman Nick Gravenites as a special guest. As a writer, singer and producer Gravenites has performed with many of rock's legendary artists, including Janis Joplin, Muddy Waters, Electric Flag and Paul Butterfield.

Also appearing at the concert is Mike McGowan and the Mighty Delta Roadmasters. A Yolo County Supervisor, McGowan is all about fun when it comes to performing.

"This is our hobby, playing fundraisers for charities and groups we like to support," said McGowan. "We want people to get out on the dance floor, clap their hands, smile and just have a great time. We get the privilege of playing and hopefully only a few people plug their ears."

The concert will benefit Capay Valley Vision, a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving the valley's heritage, rural character, agriculture, history and natural environment. Members work to establish a community-wide vision for the future and to facilitate an on-going collaborative process.
