All individuals, families and kids are welcome to come and participate in a community meeting to discuss Highway 16 / Esparto Downtown Streetscape Design. Capay Valley Vision, in partnership with the Local Government Commission and Glatting Jackson Kercher Anglin, Inc., are pleased to invite you to a community meeting to be held at Alice Marsh Hall on the Esparto High School Campus on March 2nd & 3rd.

The purpose of this meeting is to work together as a community to create an active, safe, and successful main street environment in Downtown Esparto. Community feedback will be used to develop an Esparto Downtown/Highway 16 Corridor Revitalization Plan this spring with funding through the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG).

The Friday, March 2nd meeting will be a community forum. There will be a presentation and opportunity for community feedback. Pizza will be provided for those who attend.

On Saturday, March 3rd there will be walking audit of downtown. Everyone will be invited to walk downtown and share his or her thoughts on Downtown Esparto. Then we will return Alice Marsh Hall and work in small groups to design our new Downtown. A light breakfast will be provided and lunch.

The March 2nd & 3rd meeting will be led by walkable communities and street design expert Dan Burden. *Time* magazine highlighted Dan as one of the civic innovators of the 21st Century. He has been a National Geographic photographer and now uses his photography as a powerful tool to present ideas and inspire solutions. Dan has worked with over 1,000 communities in North America to help them create safer, healthier and more economically successful communities.

In the days following the March meeting, based on the community input the Local Government Commission/Glatting Jackson consultant team will prepare detailed and comprehensive street design solutions for traffic flow and safety, pedestrian and bicycle access, beautification, and parking. Concepts and guidelines for future development will also be developed to help revitalize the Downtown and preserve Esparto's rural, small town and historic character.
